Early childhood, particularly the first 5 years of life, impacts long-term social, cognitive, emotional, and physical development. Healthy development in early childhood helps prepare children for the educational

experiences of kindergarten and beyond. Early childhood development and education are key determinants of future health and well-being. Addressing the disparities in access to early childhood development and education opportunities can greatly bolster young children's future health outcomes.

Wilson Forward's mission is to improve Wilson's educational opportunities, health and wellness, and workforce development, and we approach every opportunity and challenge through a collaborative lens. Community partners convene routinely to discuss ongoing work, progress towards identified goals, and new partnership and collaboration opportunities through initiatives like the Wilson Wellness Collaborative.

Overdose deaths occurring among North Carolina residents have been on the rise. The misuse of and addiction to opioids—including prescription pain relievers, heroin, and synthetic opioids such as fentanyl—is a serious national crisis that affects

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates that the total "economic burden" of prescription opioid misuse alone in the United States is \$78.5 billion a year, including the costs of healthcare, lost productivity, addiction treatment, and criminal justice involvement. 
